A meeting of the Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic Development (FSTED) Council was held on September 2, 2020 via teleconference. Chairwoman Amy Miller called the meeting to order. The Assistant Secretary called the roll. Members present were:

Agenda Item 3a, Approval of the February 6, 2020 Meeting Minutes, was taken up. A motion was made by Mr. Kuryla, seconded by Mr. Stubbs, and passed approving the minutes.

Agenda Item 3b, Approval of the February 28, 2020 Meeting Minutes, was taken up. A motion was made by Mr. Magidson, seconded by Mr. Kuryla, and passed approving the minutes.

Agenda Item 3c, Report on Seaport Environmental Management Committee (SEMC) Meeting, was taken up. Ms. Grigsby provided the members with a report on SEMC. The Committee met on September 1<sup>st</sup> and discussed the recent draft turbidity rule released by the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP). Staff will continue to work with the Department on the rulemaking process to consider ports and hurricanes for coastal turbidity regulations.

Agenda Item 3d, Report on FSTED Security Committee, was taken up. Mr. Rubin provided the members with a report on the September 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of the Committee. The Governor's \$1 billion veto package included a veto of the \$2 million for FSTED Security grants. This will affect the statewide ARES system the ports are currently using. As it stands there are no additional state or federal dollars available to continue the service at a statewide level. Staff is continuing to work with CDC and their recent request for information for the resumption of cruising. There are 28 questions in the RFI, and a collaborative response in addition to interested individual responses will be sent for Florida cruise ports.

Agenda Item 4, Reports and Studies, was taken up. Ms. Grigsby presented on the reports. The Seaport Mission Plan was delayed due to the previously mentioned funding roadblocks; however, it was released prior to the meeting. All cargo and cruise numbers were record setting. Staff will begin preparation for next years SMP in the coming weeks, coordinating messaging and data that may be affected by COVID-19. John Martin conducted a mini-economic impact analysis that is within the FSTED meeting materials. The cruise numbers reported only county embarkations, so that number should be doubled when discussing economic effect in Florida.

Agenda Item 5, Legislative Report, was taken up. Mr. Rubin noted that leadership elections will place during Organizational Session in mid-November this year. Regular session will convene on March 2<sup>nd</sup> in Tallahassee, with little known in the way of revenue forecasting at this time.

Agenda Item 6, Agency Reports, was taken up. Ms. Fierst presented the report on behalf of DEO. Fierst thanked Mr., Ken Lawson for his service and announced the new Executive Director: Dane Eagle. DEO will be co-hosting a Cyber Security Forum on September 16<sup>th</sup> with the Associated Industries of Florida and Florida Makes. Secretary Kevin Thibault reported on behalf of FDOT. The Freight Mobility & Trade Plan is complete and an excerpt included within the meeting materials for FSTED. The FDOT Seaports & Waterways Plan process is beginning, this is a statutorily required update that must be done every five years. Thibault indicated that the Strategic Ports Investment Initiative is looking at updating their methodology for allocations. Thibault indicated once they reach consensus on that they will hold a publicly noticed meeting to workshop the input. That workshop is expected to occur in early 2021.

Agenda Item 7a, Discussion and Review of Seaport Funding Spend Downs, was taken up. Chair Miller asked for seaport-on-seaport funding spend downs by several seaports. The berth rehabilitation at Port Manatee with about \$724,000 remaining is in the process of acquiring a time extension according to Mr.



Sanford. The berth has had some additional damage and the port will need to do an emergency procurement, then the spend down should happen quickly. Port Fernandina has two grants for cargo improvements, wharf maintenance, and dredging totaling \$187,500 and \$7,902 that will both request an extension according to Mr. Ragucci. JAXPORT has requested and been approved for a contract extension according to Mr. Wong for the terminal bulkhead reconstruction. Chair Miller explained that the Port of Pensacola's Berth 6 Rehabilitation has a remaining balance of \$753,000, and that a reallocation letter is in the packet to address later in the agenda. The Port of Palm Beach has three projects that were spent down since the grant sheets were reported.

Agenda Item 7b, Approval of Reallocation of FY 20/21 FSTED Program Funds, was taken up. The Port of Ft. Pierce requested that the balance of Fisherman's Wharf Redevelopment be moved to the rehab of the South Dock. The 2<sup>nd</sup> project by Ft. Pierce is to move the money currently on Berth Improvements and the Seagrass Study to the Terminal Improvements Project which is an immediate need for the port. A motion was made by Mr. Stubbs, seconded by Mr. Almira, and passed approving the reallocation for the Port of Ft. Pierce. The Port of Pensacola requested that the remaining balance of \$753,000 from the Berth 6 Rehab be moved to the maintenance dredge. The amount seems high; however, this was due to the over estimation of how much work was needed on the bulkhead. A motion was made by Mr. Murray, seconded by Mr. Magidson, and passed approving the reallocation for the Port of Pensacola. Grigsby indicated all reallocations were coordinated with DOT, and moving forward please let Council staff know in advance if funds will need to be moved. These reallocations will affect DOT's available budget capacity, and Council staff will need to coordinate the ability to move funds with Department staff.

Agenda Item 7c, Agency Reports on Consistency Review of FY 21/22 FSTED Program Project Applications, was taken up. Ms. Fierst thanked the Council and staff for their coordination, DEO found 53 projects to be consistent with F.S. 311. Secretary Thibault indicated that they also found the project to be consistent. A motion was made by Mr. Daniels, seconded by Mr. Murray, to accept the consistency review by DEO and FDOT. Motion passed.

Agenda Item 7d, Recommendation and Approval of FY 21/22 FSTED Program Allocations, was taken up. Mr. Wheeler and Grigsby provided an overview of the FSTED Program Allocations. An amended chart was provided to participants, as the one in the packet had an excess of \$100 allocated from debt service. Over \$1 billion of project requests were received this year for the available \$25 million. The FSTED Data and planning line item saw a reduction of over \$100,000 from last year. Staff has worked with the Chair and vendors to revise and update contracts that resulted in this savings. A motion was made by Mr. Almira, seconded by Mr. Murray, to approve the FSTED Program Allocations. Motion passed.

Agenda Item 8a, FSTED Bylaws, was taken up. Wheeler presented the recommendations of the By-laws changes from the By-laws committee created by Chair Miller. The committee consisted of: Ryan Fierst from DEO, Basil Binns, Mike Poole, and Paul Anderson. The updates to the By-Laws addressed the clarification of language from the February 2020 meeting, updates to F.S. references within Section 311, and spelling out the members of the Council. A motion was made by Mr. Murray, seconded by Mr. Almira, to accept the FSTED By-laws edits. Mr. Stubbs asked why FDOT wasn't on the committee. Chair Miller indicated that the By-laws committee was a chance to get DEO more involved within the Council. Updates within the By-laws were taken from previous advisement from FDOT, though they did



not participate on the sub-committee. Secretary Thibault requested that the by-laws be tabled until a later meeting so that seaport staff could review again and provide comments. Mr. Murray updated his motion to indicate that the By-laws be tabled and re-sent to the Council for questions, comments, or concerns. Mr. Kuryla seconded the motion.

Agenda Item 8b, FSTED New Officer Elections, was taken up. Mr. Stubbs was the chair of the FSTED Council Nominating Committee. The nominating committee had a dynamic slate and conversation of people able to take on leadership roles this year. After debate the final recommended slate was: Chair-Captain John Murray; Vice Chair- Paul Anderson; and Secretary/Treasurer-Juan Kuryla. Mr. Stubbs made a motion for the Council to approve the recommended slate comments, Mr. Almira seconded the motion.

Chair Miller thanked staff, partner agencies, and the FSTED Council for their faith in her and coordination with her during her tenure as Chair.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:10 p.m.

#### **BY-LAWS**

#### ARTICLE I NAME, LOCATION

The name of this organization shall be the Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic Development Council, hereinafter referred in these By-Laws, as "the Council." The principal office of the Council shall be located in Tallahassee, Florida.

### ARTICLE II OBJECTIVES

The primary objectives of the Council are as provided by state law, including those statutory requirements contained in Chapter 311, Chapter 315, section 163.3178(2)(k), section 339.135(4), section 341.053, section 320.20, and section 403.061, Florida Statutes. These statutory objectives include, but are not limited to, the requirement that the Council, the Department of Transportation, and the Department of Economic Opportunity work in cooperation to review projects and allocate state funds to finance port transportation or port facilities projects that will improve the movement and intermodal transportation of cargo or passengers in commerce and trade and support the interests, purposes, and requirements of all ports.

#### ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP

The membership of the Council shall be the port director, or the port director's designee, of each of the ports of Jacksonville, Port Canaveral, Port Citrus, Fort Pierce, Palm Beach, Port Everglades, Miami, Port Manatee, St. Petersburg, Tampa, Port St. Joe, Panama City, Pensacola, Key West, and Fernandina; the secretary of the Department of Transportation or his or her designee; and the director of the Department of Economic Opportunity or his or her designee.

#### ARTICLE IV FSTED ORGANIZATION

- A) Governing and Policy-Making Body The members of the Council are the governing and policy-making body of the Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic Development and other statutorily associated programs shall have full power to do any and all things necessary or desirable in carrying out the objectives of said Programs, within the limitations provided in law.
- B) Officers- A Nominating Committee selected by the Chair shall prepare officer

nominations and make recommendations to the Council. The Nominating Committee shall be comprised of the immediate past Chair of the Council (if available) and at least two other members selected by the Chair. The election of officers shall be determined by a majority of voting members present at the appropriate general meeting. All officers shall take office on the first date of the new fiscal year beginning October 1 and serve for a term of 1 year until their successor assumes the duties of the office. The term of officers can be renewed for one consecutive term.

- C) <u>Chair</u> The Chair of the Council will be elected by the members of the Council on an annual basis. The election shall be determined by a majority of voting members present at the meeting. He or she shall preside at all meetings of the Council, and at the discretion of the Council, the Chair may be an ex officio member of any committees of the Council. He or she shall, at his or her own discretion or by decision of the Council, establish all ad hoc committees and task forces and appoint the members thereof. He or she shall perform such other duties as may be provided for in law, these By-Laws, or by vote of the Council. The Chair must be an active port director from one of the eligible ports listed in section 311.09(1), Florida Statutes.
- D) Vice Chair The Vice Chair of the Council will be elected in the same manner as the Chair. The Vice Chair is empowered to act, in the absence or disability of the Chair, on behalf of the Chair in all of the Council matters and may, at the discretion of the Council, be an ex officio member of any committees of the Council. The Vice Chair must be an active port director from one of the eligible ports listed in section 311.09(1), Florida Statutes.
- E) <u>Treasurer/Secretary</u> If desired, the Council may elect a joint Treasurer/Secretary of the Council in the same manner as the Chair. The Treasurer/Secretary shall examine the expenditures of the Council and, if necessary, present a report of the financial condition of the Council at each regular meeting of the Council. The Chair may also create a Ways and Means Committee to examine such issues and report to the Council. The Treasurer/Secretary, if elected, shall serve as the Chair of the Ways and Means Committee. The Treasurer/Secretary must be an active port director from one of the eligible ports listed in section 311.09(1), Florida Statutes.
- F) Ad hoc Project Review Committee If desired, the Council may create a standing ad hoc project review committee composed of one representative from the Department of Economic Opportunity, one representative from the Department of Transportation, and two representatives from the seaports appointed by the Chair. The members of the Council may delegate to the ad hoc project review committee any powers necessary for project evaluation or other related issues. If directed by the Chair, the ad hoc project review committee shall review and approve or disapprove emergency project applications or approved projects that have a major change requiring the submission of an emergency application or new application after the Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic Development Program Fiscal Year funding cycle application period has expired.
- G) <u>Certification of Instruments</u> Each officer of the Council shall have the authority, when necessary or appropriate, to certify the records, proceedings, rules and regulations and other instruments of the Council and to attest to the records and

proceedings of the Council.

#### ARTICLE V MEETINGS

- A) General Meetings Meetings of the Council shall be held a minimum of two (2) times a year at a location to be determined by the Chair of the Council. Additional meetings of the membership may be held at the call of the Chair or shall be called by the Chair at the written request of a majority of the membership.
- B) <u>Monthly Meetings</u> The Council may hold monthly meetings with representatives from the Department of Economic Opportunity and the Department of Transportation to facilitate the project evaluation process and other related issues.
- C) Emergency Meetings Emergency meetings of the Council may be held at the call of the Chair or shall be called by the Chair at the written request of a majority of the membership. Emergency meetings shall be conducted pursuant to section 120.525, Florida Statutes.
- D) Quorum A majority of the members, or their designees, shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of transacting the business of the Council. The withdrawal of any voting members or their designees after the commencement of a meeting shall have no effect on the existence of a quorum after a quorum has been established at such a meeting. A vote of the majority of the voting members present is sufficient for action of the Council unless these By-Laws require a greater vote for a particular action.
- E) <u>Robert's Rules</u> "Robert's Rules of Order," as revised, shall govern the conduct of all meetings of the Council whenever specific provisions of the By-Laws are not applicable.
- F) <u>Privilege of the Floor</u> Privilege of the floor at meetings of the Council shall be governed by these By-Laws, but the presiding officer, at their discretion, may allow any person the courtesy of the floor.
- G) Order of Business at Membership Meetings The order of business at the Council meetings shall be stated in advance of the meetings and materials shall be prepared and made available to all delegates representing members prior to the time of said meeting. Exceptions to the order may be made to accommodate sudden new business or other scheduling issues.
- H) <u>Public Meetings</u> All meetings of the Council and committees shall be scheduled pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 120 and 286, Florida Statutes.

#### ARTICLE VI COMMITTEES

The Chair of the Council may establish any committee or task force they deem important to the management of the Council and its programs and shall determine the process and requirements

for participation and the selection of members. The Chair of the Council may periodically request reports on the purpose, member composition, and status of all active committees or task forces. The Chair or Council can also abolish any such committee or task force so established.

### ARTICLE VII ADMINISTRATIVE STAFFING & PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

A) <u>Staff Services for Council Administration</u> Administrative Staffing Services for Council Administration—Pursuant to section 311.09(11), the Council may elect to provide an administrative staff or to contract with an entity to provide administrative services to the Council on matters relating to the business of the Council. The staff, if provided, shall perform duties or perform such administrative services as specified by the Council by resolution or written agreement for a specified period not exceeding a five-year period prior. Subject to review and approval of the Council, this resolution or written agreement may be extended ad infinitum for additional five-year periods. The cost of such administrative services shall be paid by seaport members with funds derived in accordance with section 311.09(11), Florida Statutes.

In addition to the duties and administrative services specified by the Council in the resolution or written agreement, Administrative staff elected by the Council shall record all the votes and the minutes of the Council, attend to the serving of notices of all meetings when required, and keep in safe custody all records of the Council. The Chair also may direct administrative staff to perform other ministerial functions as assigned by the Council.

- B) <u>Selection</u>, <u>Retention of Professional Service Providers</u> The Council shall select the most competent and qualified providers of professional services which best meets the needs of the Council, in the most economical and efficient manner. The Council shall comply with the provisions of section 287.057, Florida Statutes and Florida Administrative Code 60-A1 for the purchase of any services. If required by Florida law, the Chair shall establish a selection committee to ensure the selection of the most competent and qualified providers of professional services as approved and directed by the Council.
- C) <u>Contracts with Professional Service Providers</u> Except as otherwise exempted by law, moneys derived from the Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic Development Program shall be expended in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 311, Florida Statutes and Florida Administrative Code 60A-1. Providers of professional services shall be engaged by written agreement for a specified period not exceeding a five-year period. These services, contracts, and agreements are subject to audits and review by the Department of Transportation and the Department of Financial Services in addition to an external audit by the FSTED Council.
- D) <u>Length of Professional Service Contracts</u> Services may be renewed for additional specified periods, not exceeding a five-year period, subject to a review and evaluation at least once every five years. A majority of the Council members may request the Council Chair to initiate a review and evaluation at any time during the engagement period with a professional service provider. The professional services listed herein

- may be secured on an ongoing basis or secured solely on an as-needed basis as applicable.
- E) <u>External Audit Services</u> The Council may elect to contract with an entity to provide auditing services to the Council on matters relating to the business of the Council. The cost of such services shall be paid by seaport members with fees collected pursuant to Article VIII, Fees.
- F) Other Professional Services Such other professional services shall be retained as required and may be included as part of the services enumerated herein. Such services may be retained for periods and terms as required by the Council subject to the other requirements contained in this Article. The cost for data and analysis services that will assist the Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic Development Program and international trade may be spent in accordance with section 311.07, Florida Statutes.

#### ARTICLE VIII FEES

- A) <u>Schedule</u> The schedule and payment by the seaport members of any fees and expenses incurred by the Council shall be determined by the Chair and approved by an action of the Council. Such fees and expenses shall be incurred in connection with the business of the Council.
- B) <u>Compensation</u> Members of the Council shall serve without compensation but are entitled to receive reimbursement from their respective governing entity for per diem and traveling expenses as provided in section 112.061, Florida Statutes.

### ARTICLE IX AMENDMENTS

Any and all references to Statute or Administrative Code shall mean the specified Statute or Administrative Code, as amended or revised from time-to-time, or any successor thereto. These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any meeting provided a quorum of members is present and the proposed changes have been submitted to the membership in writing at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting.

#### STATEMENT: Florida Ports Council Issues Statement Regarding Senate Transportation Committee's Action on the Preemption of Seaport Regulations (SB 426)

**TALLAHASSEE**, **Fla.** (March 10, 2021) – Florida Ports Council President & CEO Doug Wheeler provided the following statement regarding today's legislative action on Senate Bill 426.

"The Florida Senate Transportation Committee today advanced SB 426 after amending the bill to remove some of the unintended consequences which would have broadly preempted local government ownership of Florida's 15 deep water seaports – a governance model that has been in place since before Florida's 1845 statehood.

"The Florida Ports Council thanks Senator Jim Boyd for his willingness to seek a solution that protects Florida's seaports governance structure, while also protecting international maritime commerce. However, we remain concerned the bill negatively impacts four municipal ports, restricting their ability to recruit new cruise ship port activity that would generate additional economic opportunities.

"As this bill, and its companion HB 267 continue to move through the legislative process, we look forward to working with lawmakers to help ensure that ownership and control of Florida's 14 deep water seaports remain with their respective local governments."

#### FLORIDA'S SEAPORTS ECONOMIC IMPACT:

- 14 deep water seaports.
- Generating 900,000 direct and indirect jobs, and
- \$117.6 billion to Florida's economy through cargo and cruise activities.
- · Account for approximately 13 percent of Florida's GDP, and

We have closed on the refinancing of the of the 2011A and 2011B Florida Ports Financing Commission bonds for both the STTF and Intermodal programs. Our professional counsel and advisors on this issue did a fantastic job with respect to the closing and the combined total debt service savings is \$19,632,469.47. We have attached a summary of the savings and closing costs.

We worked with our partners in the FDOT and CFO offices to finalize all documents to ensure we could issue these bonds on March 4<sup>th</sup>. This process was not aided by social distance COVID protocols and we really appreciate the effort by everyone to make the necessary changes to the final documents in time for the March 4<sup>th</sup> closing.

As you know from the FPFC meetings on this issue, seaports that are authorized to receive refinancing proceeds by the FSTED Council will be responsible for paying the closing costs of this refinancing. The final total closing costs are \$295,571.75. The Financing Commission will invoice those seaports for the costs using a pro rata formula measured by each recipient's share of the project funds as compared to the total funds disbursed to all recipients.

We will be holding follow-up public meetings of the FSTED Council and the FPFC Commission to finalize any necessary procedures and guidelines for the disbursement of funds and the invoicing of closing costs.

Again, congratulations and thank you to all our professional partners for helping us hold a successful refinancing closing.

## TAB 7e Federal Funding Opportunities

## Fiscal Year 2021 Port Security Grant Program

#### 1. What is the purpose of the FY 2021 PSGP?

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 Port Security Grant Program (PSGP) is one of four grant programs that constitute the Department of Homeland Security (DHS)/Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA's) focus on transportation infrastructure security activities. These grant programs are part of a comprehensive set of measures authorized by Congress and implemented by DHS to help strengthen the Nation's critical infrastructure against potential terrorist attacks. PSGP provides funds to state, territorial, local, and private sector partners to support increased port-wide risk management and protect critical surface transportation infrastructure from acts of terrorism.

#### 2. What legislation authorized funding for the FY 2021 PSGP?

Section 102 of the *Maritime Transportation Security Act of 2002* (Pub. L. No. 107-295), codified as amended (46 U.S.C. § 70107). PSGP funding was appropriated by Congress in the *Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act, 2021* (Pub. L. No. 116-260).

#### 3. How much funding is available under the FY 2021 PSGP?

The total amount of funds distributed under the FY 2021 PSGP will be \$100 million.

#### 4. What are the changes in funding levels between FY 2020 and FY 2021?

The FY 2021 funding level for the PSGP is the same as FY 2020.

#### 5. Where is the FY 2021 PSGP Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) located?

The FY 2021 PSGP NOFO is located online at www.fema.gov/grants as well as www.grants.gov.

#### 6. Who is eligible to apply for FY 2021 PSGP funds?

All entities subject to an Area Maritime Security Plan, as defined by 46 U.S.C. § 70103(b), may apply for PSGP funding. Eligible applicants include, but are not limited to, port authorities, facility operators, and state and local government agencies.

Any ferry system electing to participate and receive funds under the FY 2021 PSGP will not be eligible to participate in the FY 2021 Transit Security Grant Program (TSGP) and will not be considered for funding under the FY 2021 TSGP. Likewise, any ferry system that participates in the TSGP will not be eligible for funding under the PSGP.

#### 7. What is meant by "facility operator" as an eligible entity?

A facility operator owns, leases, or operates any structure or facility of any kind located in, on, under, or adjacent to any waters subject to the jurisdiction of the United States. Examples of facility operators



include, but are not limited to, terminal operators, ferry systems, bar/harbor pilots, and merchant's exchanges.

#### 8. What types of security-related activities are allowable under PSGP?

Allowable activities and costs will generally fall under one of the following categories:

- Planning
- Operational Activities, including Operational Packages
- Equipment and Capital Projects
- Training and Awareness Campaigns
- Exercises
- Maintenance and Sustainment

Please refer to the <u>Preparedness Grants Manual</u> for detailed information on these allowable cost categories.

#### 9. What makes a strong Investment Justification (IJ)?

- Clearly identified risks, vulnerabilities, and consequences;
- Description of findings from a previously conducted vulnerability assessment;

#### IS THE EJCPS PROGRAM RIGHT FOR MY ORGANIZATION'S PROJECT?

Before you read further into this Request for Applications (RFA), you need to first determine which program – the EJ Collaborative Problem Solving Program (EJCPS) which is the subject of this RFA or the Environmental Justice Small Grants Program (EJSG) which is issued separately - to apply for. Be aware, an applicant can receive a grant under only one of these programs – not both – so you should only apply for one of them. The RFAs for the EJSG and EJCPS are being released at the same time, but to increase accessibility and diversity among recipients, an applicant can only receive one of these grants under these FY 21 competitions. While an applicant can apply under either one or both of these opportunities, they can only receive one award, and if an applicant is tentatively identified for selection under both of them they will be notified that they will have to decide which award they want. Therefore, applicants need to think carefully about which program better lines up with their capacity and the scope of the project you will be proposing. Both programs promote the use of collaborative partnerships in addressing local environmental and/or public health issues, but they are very different.

In short, EJCPS is designed for organizations that are more established and familiar with federal grants, while EJSG funding, under the other competition, is designed for organizations that are: 1) just starting out, 2) have smaller staffs and operating budgets, and/or 3) have never received a federal grant before. 1) Public Education, Training, Emergency Planning, and/or Investigations on Impacts of COVID-19 on Underserved Communities and Vulnerable Populations— EPA may give special consideration to projects that address the impacts that the current COVID-19 pandemic has on vulnerable populations. #### I. FUNDING OPPORTUNITY DESCRIPTION

#### A. DEFINITION OF ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE

EPA defines "environmental justice" as the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people regardless of race, color, national origin or income with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies. Fair treatment means that no one group of people, including racial, ethnic, or socioeconomic groups, should bear a disproportionate share of the negative environmental consequences resulting from industrial, municipal, and commercial operations or the execution of federal, state, local, and tribal environmental programs and policies. Meaningful involvement means that: (1) potentially underserved community residents have an appropriate opportunity to participate in decisions about a proposed activity that will affect their environment and/or health; (2) the public's contribution can influence the regulatory agency's decision; (3) the concerns of all participants involved will be considered in the decision-making process; and (4) the decision-makers seek out and facilitate the involvement of those potentially underserved. An "underserved community", for the purposes of this competition, refers to a community with environmental justice concerns and/or vulnerable populations, including people of color, low income, rural, tribal, indigenous and homeless populations that may be disproportionately impacted by environmental harms and risks and has a local environmental and/or public health issue that is identified in the applicant's application.

#### B. BACKGROUND & EJ COLLABORATIVE PROBLEM-SOLVING MODEL

The purpose of the EJCPS Program is for EPA to provide financial assistance to support community-based organizations to collaborate and partner with other stakeholders (e.g., local businesses and industry, local government, medical service providers, academia, etc.) to develop solutions that will significantly address environmental and/or public health issue(s) at the local level. The program's objective is to support projects that demonstrate the utility of the Environmental Justice Collaborative Problem-Solving Model. Because this program requires substantial involvement and interaction between the applicant and EPA, these awards will be made in the form of cooperative agreements. See Section II.B of this solicitation for more details on cooperative agreements.

For the purposes of the EJCPS Program, collaborative problem-solving is defined as an effort to bring together groups and resources (*e.g.*, information, labor, money) by three or more stakeholders to solve a set of problems that any single entity cannot solve individually. Collaborative problem-solving builds upon existing community understanding to establish and maintain partnerships capable of producing meaningful environmental and/or public health results. To provide a systematic approach towards collaborative problem-solving, OEJ has developed a Collaborative Problem-Solving Model (Model). Such a Model is intended to assist vulnerable and underserved communities in developing proactive, strategic, and visionary approaches to address their environmental justice issues and achieve community health and sustainability.

Collaborative problem-solving also involves developing a well-designed strategic plan with a built-in evaluation component to measure and achieve results on local environmental and/or public health issues and to sustain the partnerships. These elements are cross-cutting and interdependent and should be utilized in a proactive, strategic, and iterative manner. Determining

which elements to undertake, and in what order, can vary greatly, however, depending upon the unique facts and circumstances surrounding each environmental and/or public health issue. Not all the elements are required to be used in every situation. Rather, the CPS Model and its seven elements can be viewed as a "tool box" filled with different tools that can be used as needed. The seven elements are as follows:

- 1. Issue Identification, Visioning, and Strategic Goal-Setting;
- 2. Community Capacity-Building and Leadership Development;
- 3. Development of Multi-Stakeholder Partnerships and Leveraging of Resources;
- 4. Consensus Building and Dispute Resolution;
- 5. Constructive Engagement with Other Stakeholders;
- 6. Sound Management; and
- 7. Evaluation

A key starting point for any collaborative problem-solving project is the identification of an environmental and/or public health issue and the community's leadership in formulating goals (e.g., diesel reduction, lead abatement, reducing high incidence of asthma, land use changes, pollution prevention, implementation of fish advisories, hazardous waste, emissions reduction, risk reduction, community cleanups, or compliance with local environmental and/or public health regulations, etc.). Collaborative problem-solving involves the establishment and/or maintenance of partnerships between and among other stakeholders and the underserved community to address the community's local environmental and/or public health issues.

These partnerships can include, but are not limited to the following stakeholder groups:

- Other local community-based non-profit organizations;
- Local, regional, and national environmental non-profit organizations;
- State, local, and tribal governments;
- Federal government agencies;
- Health care providers;
- Faith-based organizations and local churches;
- Philanthropic organizations;
- Civic organizations;
- Local economic and/or community development corporations/organizations;
- Educational institutions (e.g. schools, colleges, and universities);
- State, local and tribal government agencies;
- Local Businesses and Industry;
- Elected officials (you may not use Federal grant funds or cost-sharing funds to conduct lobbying activities); and
- Labor and professional organizations.

**TYPES OF PROJECTS** - The EJCPS Program has funded a wide range of projects and project types over the years that address local environmental and public health concerns through collaborative partnerships. All proposed projects should include activities designed to engage, educate, and empower communities to understand the local environmental and public health issues

and to identify ways to address these issues at the local level. Types of projects the EJCPS program has funded in the past include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Air Quality & Asthma
- Water Quality & Sampling
- Food Access to reduce vehicle travel and fuel emissions
- Stormwater Issues & Green Infrastructure
- Lead contamination
- Pesticides and other Toxic Substances
- Healthy Homes
- Illegal Dumping
- Emergency Preparedness and Disaster Resiliency
- Environmental Job Training
- Youth Development through Environmental Education

All projects considered for funding under this announcement must include a work plan. All work plans should include strategies for addressing local environmental and public health issues, educating and empowering the community about those issues, and approaches to building consensus and setting community priorities. In addition, the work plan should demonstrate collaboration with other stakeholders (e.g., other community-based organizations, environmental groups, businesses, industry, federal, tribal, state and local governments, and academic institutions) in an effort to realize project goals and objectives and build project sustainability leading to ongoing efforts that address the local environmental justice issue(s).

**Virtual EJ Grantee Training Workshop** – During the two-year project period, all EJCPS recipients will be required to attend a virtual EJ Grantee Networking and Training Workshop hosted by their nearest EPA regional office. Each EPA regional office will schedule and develop the agenda for their own workshop. The networking workshop is designed to: 1) connect current EJ grant recipients with past recipients and community partners, 2) assist all community stakeholders with strategic planning for their communities, 3) facilitate grantees accessing additional resources and 4) provide general project management and federal grant guidance.

EJ Grant Applicant Database - The EJ grant program strives to support as many community-based organizations that apply to our EJ grant opportunities as possible, regardless of their ultimate success in receiving a grant, by 1) familiarizing applicants with federal grant application requirements, 2) sharing expectations and responsibilities of managing federal grants, 3) providing constructive feedback and recommendations on ways to strengthen unselected applications, 4) helping organizations build sustainability into projects so they continue to grow and develop after the project period is over, and 5) facilitating connections with other potential resources that can help organizations address community needs. To facilitate the achievement of these immediate goals, all applicants who apply to the 2021 opportunity will be added to our EJ Grant Applicant

**Database**. The database helps the Environmental Justice program identify and work with additional underserved communities outside the context of our grant awards.

### C. QUALIFIED ENVIRONMENTAL STATUTES

The EJCPS Program is designed to address multi-statute environmental and/or public health issues. For this reason, each project must include activities related to <u>at least one</u> of the following federal environmental statutes. Failure to clearly and conclusively identify and cite at least one of the federal statutes in your work plan may result in your project not being considered for award.

- 1. Clean Air Act, Section 103(b)(3): conduct research, investigations, experiments, demonstration projects, surveys, and studies (including monitoring) related to the causes, effects (including health and welfare effects), extent, prevention, and control of air pollution.
- 2. Clean Water Act, Section 104(b)(3): conduct and promote the coordination of research, investigations, training, demonstration projects, surveys, and studies (including monitoring) relating to the causes, effects, extent, prevention, reduction, and elimination of water pollution.
- 3. Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, Section 20(a): conduct research, development, monitoring, public education, training, demonstration projects, and studies on pesticides.
- **4. Marine Protection, Research, and Sanctuaries Act, Section 203**: conduct research, investigations, experiments, training, demonstration projects, surveys, and studies relating to the minimizing or ending of ocean dumping of hazardous materials and the development of alternatives to ocean dumping.
- 5. Safe Drinking Water Act, Section 1442(b)(3): develop and expand the capability to carry out a program (that may combine training, education, and employment) for occupations relating to the public health aspects of providing safe drinking water.
- 6. Solid Waste Disposal Act, Section 8001(a): conduct and promote the coordination of research, investigations, experiments, training, demonstration projects, surveys, public education programs, and studies relating to solid waste (e.g., health and welfare effects of exposure to materials present in solid waste and methods to eliminate such effects). Please note that applications supporting brownfields work or that include extensive clean-up activities beyond the need for a demonstration/experiment/training are not eligible for funding under this announcement.
- 7. Toxic Substances Control Act, Section 10(a): conduct research, development, monitoring, public education, training, demonstration projects, and studies on toxic substances.

On behalf of the Florida Ports Council (FPC), I am pleased to submit this letter supporting the INFRA grant application for the new bulk cargo Berth 218 at Port Tampa Bay in Hillsborough County, Florida. Port Tampa Bay is completing an application to support funding for a new public bulk cargo berth to support construction industry growth and private facility investment on Hooker's Point.

This project is a worthy investment because it will enhance the port's bulk cargo capacity, particularly for the cementitious cargoes desperately required by Florida's booming construction industry, and it will free up the adjacent Berth 219 for refrigerated commodities that are also in high demand by Florida's rapidly growing population. The new berth and associated private investment in cement storage and production will improve the capacity and the efficiency of Florida's construction materials supply chain system and will bring to life unused waterfront on a deepwater channel.

Port Tampa Bay is a receiving hub for cement, aggregates, fly ash and other cargoes that are the key raw materials for almost every construction project in west and central Florida. There is an emerging capacity shortage on the state's west coast for these materials, which could jeopardize some developments, and which adds unnecessary truck miles to an already heavily burdened highway system. Each truck that picks up cementitious products as close as possible to the ultimate destination of the product will shave off miles of truck travel. The new Berth 218 and associated private investment in storage and ready-mix plant capacity at Port Tampa Bay will save millions of vehicle miles travelled each year. That will reduce unnecessary emissions, enhance roadway safety, improve truck operations for highly perishable mixed cement, and enhance economic benefits.

Economist Martin Associates has calculated an extraordinary benefit-cost ratio for the project of more than 23:1, as well as more than \$247 million in benefits for this project over its 30-year life cycle, 22% of which comprise savings related to reduced emissions.

The proposed port development will support residential and industrial construction within a roughly 100-mile radius of Tampa, as far as Orlando to the east and Fort Myers to the south. This region's construction boom includes the nation's largest downtown real estate development: Water St. Tampa is a \$3 billion redevelopment







revitalizing the metro's core and connecting its central business district with the waterfront.

The construction industry plays a pivotal role in boosting Florida's economy, equally serving residential, commercial, and industrial markets while helping to attract foreign direct investment, boost tourism, create jobs and spur growth in multiple sectors. Any industry that can do this during our COVID-19 recovery phase, while also helping cut vehicle emissions in a growth economy, is a good choice for Florida.
